



Laptop Requirements

Students entering the Cockrell School of Engineering are required to have a laptop for use in coursework, including testing scenarios. Laptops do not need to be brought to campus on a daily basis, but individual courses may require that a laptop be brought to class, lab sessions, or tests.

Microsoft Windows 10/11 is the de facto standard. You will not be able to complete your coursework with a MacBook laptop unless you are able to install a virtual Windows environment (VMWare Fusion, Parallels, BootCamp, etc.). Be aware these options require extra processing power, RAM, HD space, and time and effort to install. MacBook laptops are **STRONGLY DISCOURAGED**. As Windows 10 is set to go out of support in the fall of 2025, we recommend getting a new laptop that supports Windows 11 now if possible.
