

Laptop Requirements

Students entering the Cockrell School of Engineering are required to have a laptop for use in coursework, including testing scenarios. Laptops do not need to be brought to campus on a daily basis, but individual courses may require that a laptop be brought to class, lab sessions, or tests.

Microsoft Windows 10/11 is the de facto standard. You will not be able to complete your coursework with a MacBook laptop unless you are able to install a virtual Windows environment (VMWare Fusion, Parallels, BootCamp, etc.). Be aware these options require extra processing power, RAM, HD space, and time and effort to install. MacBook laptops are STRONGLY DISCOURAGED. As Windows 10 is set to go out of support in the fall of 2025, we recommend getting a new laptop that supports Windows 11 now if possible.

An extended warranty with accidental damage coverage is HIGHLY recommended.
